WELCOME TO THE 2026 CONVOCATION CEREMONY FOR THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS.

Commencement, or Convocation, has its roots eight centuries in the European past and is based on the ancient practice of beginning life's work at the end of an apprenticeship. The robes and caps worn by the faculty and graduating students at the University of Illinois follow the style of Oxford University in England.

The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves. The master's gown has long closed sleeves with square ends and a slit at the elbow for the arm to come through. The doctoral gown has full, round, open sleeves with three velvet stripes; it is faced with velvet.

The hood colors and tassels you will see today indicate the wearer's field of study. At the University of Illinois, candidates for the bachelor's degree do not wear hoods, but the color of their tassel indicates the fields in which they are receiving their degree. The color for education is light blue. The candidates for the master's degrees wear hoods, and the color of their tassel is black. The candidates for doctoral degrees wear hoods lined with silk in the official orange and blue colors of the university. The velvet edging of the hood bears the color of the candidate's major field. The color of the tassel used by doctoral degree candidates at the University of Illinois is black.

At the moment the degree is conferred, the graduates move the tassels from right to left to signify their changed academic status.

The Alma Mater sculpture was first unveiled by
University of Illinois artist Lorado Taft in 1929.

A land-grant institution established in 1867, the University of Illinois has a long record of commitment to public engagement and to the discovery and application of knowledge. During the past 150 years, our faculty, staff, students, and alumni have transformed the social and economic landscape worldwide. As a leading institution of higher learning, we will continue to expand our global presence through supporting public policies that address the grand challenges of a global society, lead advancements in information and medical technology, and spur economic development.

The University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign has a responsibility to acknowledge the historical context in which it exists. In order to remind ourselves and our community, we provide the following statement. We are currently on the lands of the Peoria, Kaskaskia, Piankashaw, Wea, Miami, Mascoutin, Odawa, Sauk, Mesquaki, Kickapoo, Potawatomi, Ojibwe, and Chickasaw Nations. It is necessary for us to acknowledge these Native Nations and for us to work with them as we move forward as an institution. Over the next 150 years, we will be a vibrant community inclusive of all our differences, with Native peoples at the core of our efforts.
